While two of the boys died much too young, their remaining siblings earned an impressive number of professional certifications and college and university degrees, which they used to forge careers in the worlds of geology, medicine, business, education, and libraries. Taking their parents' advice to heart, Lena and Carrie not only contributed to the community of Gastonia through their professions, but they also became savvy investors—to the tune of \$3 million. This acumen enabled them to create the Carrie E. and Lena V. Glenn Foundation for "religious, scientific, literary, educational and eleemosynary purposes." Long after the sisters went to their rewards, the foundation continues its important work.
