Tyler Wigg - Stevenson hopes to slow this trend, suggesting that our complex global situation is forcing us to see our limits as world - changers. He calls Christians to leave aside the heady pursuit of causes and take their rightful place as standard - bearers of God's peace.

Ecoflections Jan 18 2022 Psalm 8 describes creation as the "work of his (God's) fingers." The vast world we view as so complex is really just a work done with a few fingers. There were no massive machines, no grandiose architectural designs. The universe is just a work done with a few of God's fingers. It is a picture painted by God or a fabric knitted by God. Our universe is not something simply willed by God. It is something created by God using existing substances. One Old Testament image is God creating humans by knitting them in the womb of our mother. A creation account in the book of Genesis says: "The Lord God created man out of the clay of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and so man became a living being." God used clay of the earth to create humankind. We are not simply that clay from the earth, we are formed with the very breath of God. We are like God and also like the rest of creation formed of the earth's clay. God gives us an admonition: "cultivate and care for" creation. It is God's creation not ours. The creation account also reveals how we fell from that privileged position in God's universe. Adam (a word that simply means "man") was told to "cultivate and care for" the universe. He was not to eat of the tree of knowledge of good and evil. The description of the temptation which led to mankind's sin is interesting. When man (Adam) was tempted to eat of the tree of knowledge of good and evil, he was told: "The moment you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like the gods who know what is good and what is bad." So, "original sin" - that sin which endures to this day - was not an act of disobedience to God. It was a sin of lacking faith. We do not believe that we are like God. We have to DO something (eat of the forbidden fruit) to become like God. Original sin is, first of all, a lack of faith in who we are. It is a failure to believe that everything (including us) is good. The creation account reveals that everything God created was good. It is only when we failed to believe that we and all of the universe is good that we see sin appearing in the universe. Centuries before the truths were revealed to the sons and daughters of Abraham, Native American roamed our own land. They also understood these basic truths. I came to appreciate their insight and faith as I traveled the Natchez Trace Parkway. ECOFLECTIONS is a series of poems which illustrate their faith, their insight. It also speaks of how "civilized" man came and destroyed that basic faith and insight. The Introduction invites us to be at peace so we can comprehend the meaning of our own life. "Owens Creek" invites us to slow down so we can appreciate the rest of creation. "Loess Bliss" is a huge mound formed during the ice age. Even in the midst of widespread death, life can be created. "Bear Creek Mound" reminds us that centuries before the Bible was written life and culture existed in our own land. "Rocky Springs Church" recalls how we abused the land. Because of that abuse people were forced to move. The church and its cemetery reminds of that exploitation. "Emerald Mound" invites us to make a choice for peace, living in harmony with nature and enduring life rather than war, exploitation, violence and death. "Tower of Babel" details different ways that our hearts, thus our tongues can be confused. "Spider Web" describes a spider creating a marvelous home from resources within its own body. It invites us to make similar choices. "Cave Spring" speaks of the abuse of our environment and its consequences: "The water is now unsafe to drink." "Mound" compares the simple mounds of the Native American with the glorious pyramids of the Egyptians. The way we view life is the way we will view resurrection. "Respect For Life" invites us to respect life in whatever form we encounter it. "Common WEALTH" reminds us that Water, Earth, Air, Land, and sun are our common wealth. We need to cherish them and cultivate them, not exploit
